

## EHHS Summer Reading 2018-2019

The purpose of summer reading is to get students reading over the summer in order to foster their enjoyment of literature and practice their analytical skills. Students in an honors level English course are expected to demonstrate a desire and aptitude for independent reading.

**Book List:** All students enrolled in Honors English will read the assigned book for their grade level. These texts were selected for their themes and importance to the literary canon. Most books are available at the Henderson County Public Library or local bookstores, and all are available for purchase online (and in electronic form) at Amazon.com or Barnes and Noble. In some cases, copies may also be obtained in the English department.

We suggest that as you read you annotate and take notes so that you will be prepared to discuss these works in depth. **All students, both fall and spring semester classes, will participate in a seminar and take a reading test on these books in the first week of school. In addition, students may be required to complete projects related to the summer reading in class.**

English 1: *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury

English 2: *A Moment Comes* by Jennifer Bradbury

English 3: *Catcher in the Rye* by J.D. Salinger

English 4: *Pride and Prejudice* by Jane Austen

Students who are absent for the Socratic seminar are required to turn in the AP Major Works Data Sheets and will write an in-class essay the day they return to school. Transfer students or those who enroll late in the course due to a schedule change will have three weeks to read the book, complete the reading test, AP Major Works Data Sheet, and in class essay.
