

Return to School Flowchart

A STUDENT HAS SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19

Send student and household members (e.g. siblings) home immediately. Advise student to seek medical attention, including testing for COVID-19.

POSITIVE TEST RESULT

Notify the Henderson County Department of Public Health at 828-694-6019 and notify the school nurse.

Schools will work in coordination with the health department to determine close contacts of this person.

*Close contacts (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) will be contacted directly by the health department. **Close contacts and household members of the student (e.g. siblings) should quarantine within their household for 14 days after their last contact with the positive case.** Other students and staff should self-monitor for symptoms but can continue at school.*

Has this person had close contact (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) with someone diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past 14 days?

Quarantine at home. Avoid others in the household and do not leave home except to seek medical care.

This person can return to school on campus and other activities 14 days after the last time he or she had close contact with someone with COVID-19.

**If this person later has a positive test, use criteria to the left.*

Isolate at home. Avoid others in the household and do not leave home except to seek medical care.

This student and siblings can return to school on campus and other activities when **ALL** of the following are true for each child:

- It has been at least 10 days since they first had symptoms **AND**
- They have not had a fever for 1 day (24 hours) without any fever reducing medication **AND**
- Their other symptoms have improved.

This person may be allowed to return to school on campus and other activities 24 hours after they have not had a fever without any fever reducing medication and their other symptoms have resolved.

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A STUDENT HAS HAD CLOSE CONTACT WITH SOMEONE DIAGNOSED WITH COVID-19 IN THE PAST 14 DAYS

Does the student have symptoms of COVID-19?

- Fever*
- Chills
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New cough
- New loss of taste or smell

**Fever is determined by a measured temperature of 100.4 °F or greater.*

Send student and household members (e.g. siblings) home immediately. Advise student to seek medical attention, including immediate testing for COVID-19.

Send student home immediately. Recommend testing for COVID-19 5-7 days after their last exposure to the person with COVID-19.

A STUDENT TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Notify the Henderson County Department of Public Health at 828-694-6019 and notify the school nurse. Schools will work in coordination with the health department to determine close contacts of this person. *Close contacts (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) will be contacted directly by the health department. **Close contacts and household members of the student (e.g. siblings) should quarantine within their household for 14 days after their last contact with the positive case.*** Other students and staff should self-monitor for symptoms but can continue at school on campus.

**If this person develops symptoms after testing, use criteria to the left.*
