Parent Notification for Title I - 2023-2024

Dear Fletcher Elementary Family:

We are so glad that your child is one of our students here at Fletcher Elementary! We pride ourselves in doing what is best for our students and in keeping our parents informed.

Our school is designated as a Title I School, which means that we receive additional funding that supports student learning. We use our Title I funds in these capacities:

- To hire qualified tutors to facilitate instruction to small groups of students;
- To fund an academic interventionist;
- To purchase educational materials and online subscriptions to support our curriculum;
- To expand the use of technology throughout our school;
- To provide professional development opportunities to teachers; and
- To hire an additional classroom teacher to support our student enrollment numbers.

Title I schools are required to keep parents notified about what's going on in the school. Specifically, Title I schools must communicate about opportunities for parents to be involved in school and about your rights as a parent. Our school conducts a variety of Parent Engagement activities every year. These activities are planned with help from our Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) and are designed to enhance our relationships with the school community. Please watch for information about these events coming home through our weekly Parent Newsletter, in SwiftK12 phone calls, emails, and text messages, on social media, and in written communication from your child's teacher. We'd love for you to join us!

Our school, like all the schools in Henderson County Public Schools (HCPS), participates in local and state testing. Students in kindergarten through fifth grade take three diagnostic tests in math and reading through iReady, a state-approved and locally-adopted web-based assessment tool. Students in kindergarten through third grade also participate in Amplify mClass web-based reading assessments three times a year along with progress monitoring. mClass is a diagnostic tool required by the state to show evidence of reading proficiency as outlined in the Read to Achieve legislature. Students in third through fifth grades participate in quarterly Check-Ins (NCCI) that align with our state curriculum and local pacing guides. Third through fifth graders also participate in state End of Grade (EOG) assessments that determine student growth and proficiency in reading, math, and for fifth grade only, science. You have a right to your child's testing results. NCCI and EOG assessment results are sent out to parents

and guardians through PowerSchool. If you do not receive assessment results or need additional information, please contact our school.

Finally, our school is proud of our teachers! Federal guidelines require that we provide information about their education and qualifications. You have the right to the following information:

- Whether the teacher has met the state qualifications for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or other provisional status through which the state qualifications have been waived;
- What baccalaureate degrees have been earned by the teacher, along with the field of study and any other certifications;
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications; and
- Whether your child has received four weeks or more of instruction by a non highly-qualified teacher.
